

## Seasonal Changes

This term in Class 1 we will be learning about the seasons and the changes that happen to the weather across each season.

	<p><b>Spring</b> In spring new plants and flowers start to bloom. Trees grow blossom.</p>
	<p><b>Summer</b> In summer the trees sprout new, green leaves.</p>
	<p><b>Autumn</b> In autumn the leaves turn red and orange and start to fall from the branches.</p>
	<p><b>Winter</b> In winter the trees are completely bare.</p>

**Spring-** in spring the days start to get longer and we have more daylight. The weather turns warmer.

**Summer-** in summer we get the most daylight. The weather turns hot. We should NEVER look directly at the sun as it can damage our eyes.

**Autumn-** in autumn the days start to get shorter and we have less daylight.

**Winter-** in winter the days are shorter and it gets darker much earlier. This is the coldest season and sometimes we get snow.

Not all countries have the same seasons. Some countries will always be covered in snow even in summer. Some parts of the world might never get any snow and it might always be warm.

**Rainforests** are examples of places where it rains a lot - between 2 and 10 metres of rain per year!

**Lincolnshire:** average rainfall is 0.89 metres per year.
