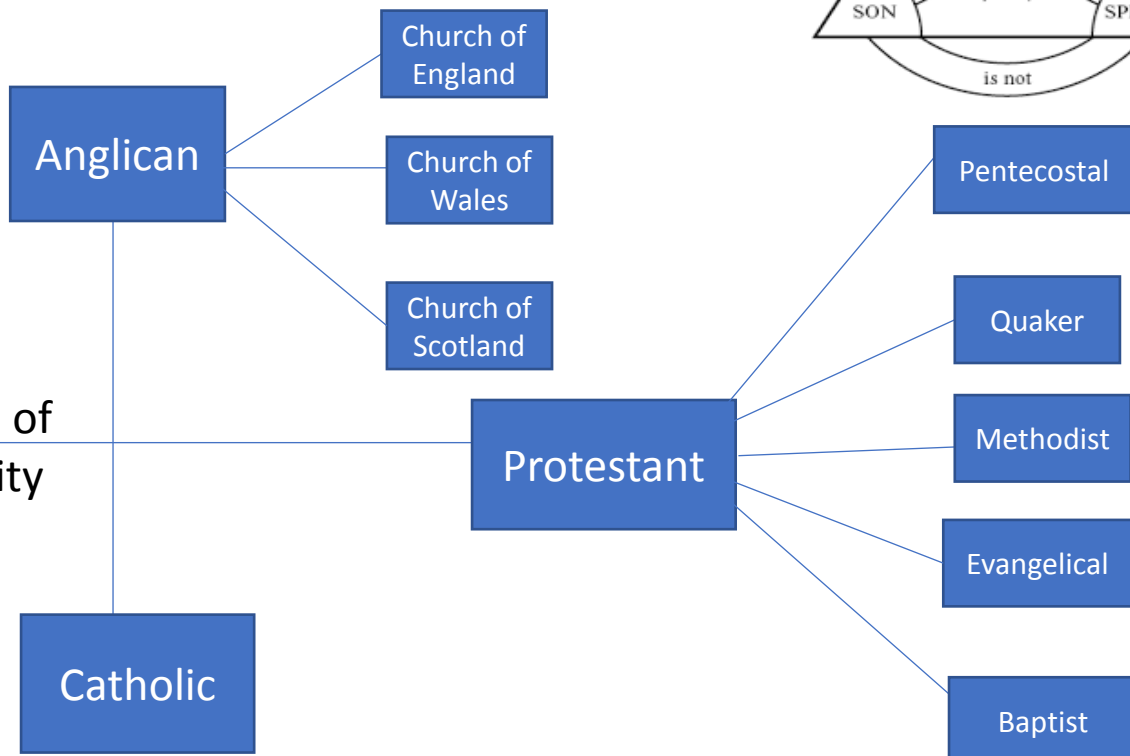
Type of Celebration	What it involves:
Baptism	A baptism is the admission of a person into the Christian faith. Different denominations baptise at different times. <b>Baptists</b> only baptise when someone is an adult, other <b>denominations</b> baptise babies.
Confirmation	Confirmation is when a baptised person affirms Christian belief and is admitted as a full member of the church. Confirmation is done at different types depending on the <b>denomination</b> , however most only confirm when the Church believes they are old enough to make their own decision.

#### Worship

**All branches of Christianity have methods of worshiping God. However, different denominations have their own types of worship:**

- Catholics: Worship centres around the sacraments; confession; pray to saints.
- Anglican: Do not pray to saints/confess; often pray in a service at Church on a Sunday, led by a priest; have a set routine and are often traditional.
- Quakers: Do not have churches, they meet in simple places; they do not have priests or services; at gatherings, Quakers can choose to be silent or speak, depending on how they feel.
- Pentecostal: find faith through experience, not through ritual or thinking; worship is energetic, uses song and gospel singing more than traditional prayer.
