



<b>Christianity</b> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Jesus gave <b>The Sermon on the Mount</b></li> <li>the '<b>Golden Rule</b>' (Mark 12:30-31) - 'love God and love your neighbour as yourself'</li> <li><b>Parables</b> guide people on how to act e.g. the Good Samaritan</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Christian groups interpret the Bible in different ways</li> <li>Christian charities e.g. Christian Aid and The Salvation Army</li> <li>Try to make everyday decisions based on the expectations for a good Christian life</li> </ul>
<b>Islam</b> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Hadith</b> (Muhammed's sayings) e.g. "None of you truly believes unless he loves for his brother what he loves for himself"</li> <li><b>Sunnah</b> (Muhammed modelled how to live a good life) e.g. The Story of The Prophet and the Ants and The Crying Camel</li> <li><b>Zakat</b> (Charity) is one of the Five Pillars</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>giving 2.5% of wealth to charity each year</li> <li>Muslim charities, e.g. the National Zakat Foundation and the Red Crescent</li> <li>Following <b>Shariah</b> - the right path for a Muslim</li> </ul>
<b>Humanism</b> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>trust <b>scientific method</b></li> <li>reject the idea of the <b>supernatural</b>.</li> <li>believe that there is no <b>afterlife</b> and humans have no overarching purpose in the universe</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>make <b>ethical decisions</b> on basis of reason, <b>empathy</b> and a concern for human beings and <b>sentient</b> animals.</li> <li>work for good causes with others of all faiths and none.</li> <li>donate time or money to charities that do not discriminate on grounds of religion (or non-religion) or promote one particular worldview.</li> </ul>




### Key Vocabulary

<b>Conscience</b>	The sense of right and wrong that governs a person's thoughts and actions.
<b>Empathy</b>	The ability to share another person's feelings and emotions as if they were your own.
<b>Hypothesis</b>	An idea which is suggested as a possible explanation for a particular situation
<b>Morally right / Ethical</b>	Something that is believed by most people to be good and right.
<b>Scientific method</b>	A method of investigation in which a problem is first identified and observations, experiments, or other relevant data are then used to construct or test hypotheses
<b>Sentient</b>	Capable of perception and feeling
<b>Supernatural</b>	Things that cannot be explained by science, such as ghosts.
<b>Via negativa</b>	sometimes we can find out what something <i>is</i> by knowing what it <i>is not</i> .
